Canine Partners was one of 5 Colorado non-profits chosen to participate in the vending-machine-style fundraising campaign.

During their 2 years of training, we involve our dogs in therapy-type services at local schools, hospitals, counseling centers and within Veteran's programs.

Kong chose Canine Partners to do a joint educational webinar about service dogs and canine enrichment.

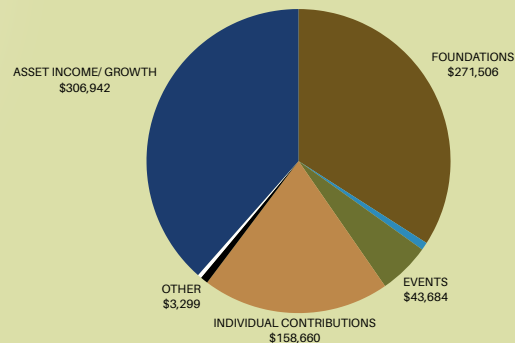
Increased our staff knowledge and continuing education around best practices and standards in the service dog field.

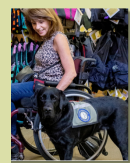
